

Welcome to Stockholm!

Sights to explore

- 1** **Royal Palace/Strömkajen.** Royal Palace is a combination of royal, residence, workplace and culture-historical monuments open for visitors to Stockholm. Strömkajen: Stockholm Sightseeing boats depart at least once every half hour.
- 2** **Gustav Adolfs Torg and the Royal Opera.**
- 3** **City Hall/Central Station.** City Hall attracts around 400,000 visitors yearly and holds the most exclusive ballroom in Stockholm, hosting the Nobel Banquet. Central Station: Trains connecting Stockholm with Arlanda Airport and other cities.
- 4** **Kulturhuset.** Visit Stockholms hot spot for contemporary cultural events. Photo exhibitions, stories for kids, concerts, literary discussions etc.
- 5** **NK/Hamngatan.** This is where you'll find the best shopping in town.
- A** **6** **Strandvägen.** Strandvägen is the main centre for lunch, brunch, dinner and other kinds of cruises in the archipelago. The boats run winter, spring, summer and autumn with a wide variety of different cruises with restaurants on board.
- B** **7** **Vasa Museum.** Vasa Museum with the world's only surviving 17th-century ship – a must for all visitors. Nordiska museet and Junibacken story book museum are also situated here.
- D** **8** **Skansen.** A miniature Sweden with both countryside and town quarters from the mid-19th century. Visit the elks, bears and lynx or pat a snake at the Aquarium. Gröna Lund (Amusement Park). Christmas market during December.
- 9** **Djurgårdsbron.** A short walk from the Museum of National Antiquities, an interesting museum packed with history. Visit the gold room, the Gothic Hall and see how the Vikings lived.
- 10** **Kaknästornet.** TV tower open to the public and has indoor and outdoor decks as well as a restaurant. With a height of 155 meters it offers a great view of Stockholm.
- 11** **Frihamnen.** One of Stockholm's ports. Arrival and departure point to cruise ships.
- 12** **Tallink/Silja.** Terminal Ferries to Helsinki and Tallinn.
- 13** **Karlaplan.** Great architecture in the wealthier areas of the city.
- 14** **Stureplan.** Shopping, restaurants and nightlife!
- C** **Skeppsholmen.** Once a military island now houses modern art at Moderna Museet, the Museum of Far Eastern Antiquities and the Swedish Museum of Architecture.
- E** **Cruise Berth/Viking Line.** This is where many cruise ships visiting Stockholm are docked and also where the cruise ships to Finland depart.
- F** **Fotografiska.** At Fotografiska you can visit exhibitions by famous photographers and their shop, dedicated to the medium of photography.
- G** **Old Town.** A good starting point to explore the city's old town, the original heart of Stockholm. Here you'll find several souvenir shops. This stop is also the closest one to the hip district SoFo at Södermalm with restaurants, pubs and interesting boutiques.
- H** **Royal Palace.** This is the Swedish Royal family's official residence and you are welcome to visit the Royal Apartments, the Treasury and the Gustav III's Museum of Antiquities. Next to the Royal Palace is Stockholm Cathedral St: Nicolai, Storkyrkan, where several coronations have been held, the first of which was in 1336.
